



XP SP2 and Vista Windows Firewall and flmservc.exe

By default, Windows Firewall is turned on when you install Microsoft Windows XP Service Pack 2. The Windows Firewall blocks the TCP/IP ports, FLM uses TCP/IP. The customer can determine whether he has static or dynamic ports. He can then manually set it as an exception in Windows Firewall. Go to www.microsoft.com, do a search on "XP SP2 sockets"

1. Click Start, and then click Run.
2. In the Run dialog box, type Firewall.cpl, and then click OK.
3. In the Windows Firewall dialog box, click Add a Program on the Exceptions tab.
4. In the Add Program dialog box, you can use the Browse button to locate the instance of flmservc.exe that you want to add to the exception list.
5. Select the name of the instance, and then click OK.
6. Under Programs and Services, select the check box that is next to the name you selected in step 6, and then click OK.
7. This operation will need to be performed on the server as well as the clients using FLM.
